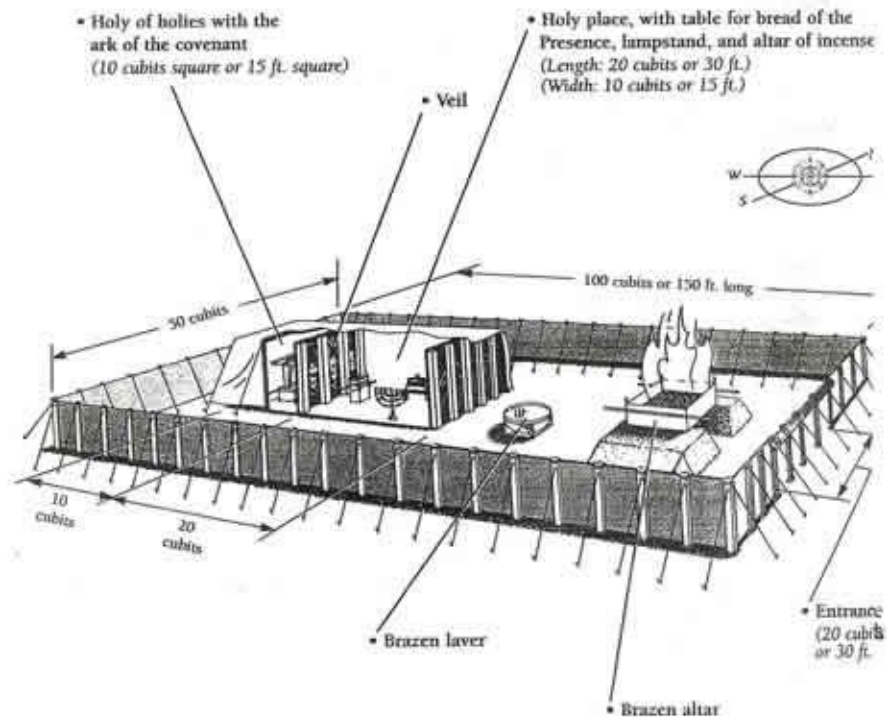

### The Day of Atonement

Leviticus 16

Aaron, the High Priest, was to take two goats that were brought to him from the congregation of Israel. He would present the two goats to the LORD at the door of the Tabernacle.

He would cast lots and determine which goat was the Lord's and which one was the scape goat.





He would then offer a bullock as a sin offering for himself and burn incense and sprinkle the blood of the bullock in front of the mercy seat. Then he would kill the LORD's goat for the sin of the people and carry the blood into the Holiest of All behind the veil. He would then sprinkle the blood upon the mercy seat which covers the Ark of the Covenant.

He would then sprinkle blood upon the altar in the Holy Place to sanctify the goat and the bullock, Aaron would then take the live goat and confess the sins of the people over the head of the scape goat.



He would then send the scape goat away at the hand of a fit man into the wilderness, far away from the people of Israel.

After the sacrifices were made and the goat released, Aaron and the man who took away the scapegoat would wash themselves thoroughly. This was to be an everlasting sign for God's people.

## How the Lord Jesus Christ fulfilled the Day of Atonement

He is the Great High Priest who offers the sacrifice for us.

1. Unlike Aaron, He did not make sacrifice for His own sins because He had none.

(Hebrews 7:27)

2. Unlike Aaron, He offered His own blood on the mercy seat. (Hebrews 9:7-14)

He is the LORD's goat.

1. He was sacrificed for our sins. (2 Corinthians 5:21)
2. His sacrifice satisfied God for our sins. (Isaiah 53:10) (1 John 2:1-2)
3. His blood was offered once for all. (Hebrews 10:5-10)

He is also the scapegoat.

1. He "taketh away the sin of the world." John 1:29
2. They are taken away forever. (1 John 2:2; 3:5)
